Understanding Movies

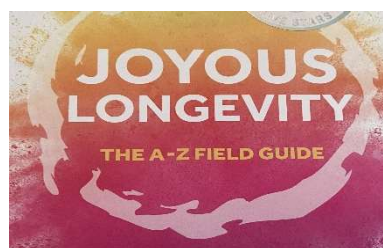
